Hand spindles are simple, pri	mitive tools that have been used to create yarn by indig	ge-
nous cultures on every contin	ent since the beginning of time. Supported spindles, di	rop
spindles, hi or low whorl spin	ndles, Mayan, Scottish, Turkish, Navajo and Russian sp	pin-
	es from India. Each requires somewhat different techni	-
to produce yarn. In this work	shop, various types of hand spindles will be demonstra	ited

and available for participants to give them a spin. Class will accommodate 12 attendees. All
materials are supplied.
Betsy Alspach: Fiber Preparation for Spinning and Felting. In this class, we will be using a variety of tools to prepare wool and other fibers to spin or felt, including flick cards, hand cards, hand combs, drum carders, a hackle, peasant combs and blending boards to create roving, batts, and rolags. We will discuss which tools to use depending on the qualities of the fibers and the type of yarn desired, i.e. worsted or woolen, how to combine colors and different types of fibers, and how to add in fibers such as those made from seaweed, bamboo, and roses. Participants will have the bulk of the time to prepare their own unique creations. All fibers and tools are provided, however, fibers brought from home to process and questions about those fibers are welcome Tools are welcome as well. Class will accommodate 15 attendees. All materials are provided, but you may bring your own fiber if you wish.
Sarah Wilde: Learn To Crochet. Crochet is having a big comeback. Not only are makers using crochet for making blankets and shawls, but also garments, socksanything you can make with a hook and yarn! There are many beautiful patterns for grannie square sweaters on Ravelry. Sarah will not only teach the stitches you'll need, but also how to read a pattern, and how to tension your yarn. You will need to bring your own size H (5mm) crochet hook and worsted weight yarn to work with. This class will accommodate 10 attendees.
